Progression Model	<p>What knowledge will pupils develop? <i>(Including Key Terminology)</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To reflect on and celebrate their achievements, identify their strengths and areas for improvement, set high aspirations and goals. • To recognise what constitutes a positive, healthy relationship and develop the skills to form and maintain positive and healthy relationships • To recognise ways in which a relationship can be unhealthy and whom to talk to if they need support • To recognise different types of relationship, including those between acquaintances, friends, relatives and families • To recognise that relationships and friendships can change and how to deal with this – including transition. • To judge what kind of physical contact is acceptable or unacceptable and how to respond and understand the consequences of these actions • To listen and respond respectfully to a wide range of people, to feel confident to raise their own concerns, to recognise and care 	<p>What skills will pupils develop? <i>(Including literacy and numeracy)</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Children explore their personal skills and talents, • Children develop their social interaction skills and their self-esteem during these celebrations of differences and talents. • Children also develop the ability to identify what makes a good friend and applying these skills to form relationships with peers. • Pupils understand the importance of working as a team and develop their teamwork skills, including how to resolve and deal with conflicts within a group or between two people.

	<p>Ideas of how parents can support children in this unit</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Encourage pupils to practise activities that they have a passion for. • Discuss common scenarios that pupils might find themselves in (inside and outside of school) and talk about how to deal with different types of conflict appropriately. • Teach pupils to have good morals and to think about how they treat others. • Discussions about what will and will not make a good friend. • Talk about responsibilities at home
	<p>Marking/ Assessment of this unit</p> <p>The lessons for SMSVC are not formally assessed as learning outcomes are subjective and personal to each individual pupil. Pupils' work will regularly be read by teachers and followed up accordingly.</p>

Discuss how they developed their talent/skill. • Teach someone else something you have learnt in school. • Make a note of some of your closest friends – write down what makes them a good friend. • Mind map the responsibilities that you have. These could be at home, at school, in a club or any other responsibilities

<p>Cross Curricular Links</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • PE: Teamwork will be a crucial part of most subjects, particularly in PE. • Art: Pupils will explore their artistic skills during this topic in their creation of a poster and their talents explore lots of different subjects (including Music, art, history, geography, PE etc). • RE: links with the Catholic Virtues embedded into each lesson and the Catholic Teachings. • English: Links with understanding empathy through text and looking at the difference to how this presents in real life and through text. • History: Skills such as working together and dealing with conflicts. all appear in the development of humans through time. Especially from Ancient Britain to Anglo-Saxons, and their goals and aspirations were just to hunt and settle! 	<p>British Values</p> <p>During this term pupils will have opportunities to explore, clarify and if necessary, challenge, their own and others' values, attitudes, beliefs, rights and responsibilities. They will learn skills, language and strategies they need in order to live healthy, safe, fulfilling, responsible and balanced lives. These sessions will enable pupils to develop their self-knowledge, self-esteem and self-confidence.
